

Dear Parents and Carers,



just some of our many achievements during this challenging academic year. Over the last few months I have been humbled by the hard work of our students, our families, our staff and our community. I know that I have mentioned this in many letters and emails, but I would like to thank all the parents who have sent words of praise to the team. We are an exceptional

At the start of the Covid-19 crisis, I came across a quote from the artist Charlie Mackesy, which I copied to all the team at Millfield in my weekly staff briefing:

"What's the best thing you've learned about storms?" asked the boy. "That they end."

These last few months have been a storm, in so many ways, for so many. Families have had many challenges, including having to adapt to working from home and remotely educating their children. Like many schools, we have discovered that some of our families have struggled with remote learning as they did not have access to enough devices, and as a school this is something we are going to try to address. However, I am incredibly proud of the determination and resilience of our students and their parents; we have seen everyone trying their absolute best, and that is all we can ask of anyone.

Back on March 18th, a day that will stay with me forever, we all found out our schools would close to most students and our Year 11s would not sit their GCSE exams. Our Year 11s, in their final week in March were incredible. Every single teacher was proud of them; they were determined, they were mature and there was hardly a dry eye when the school gave them a guard of honour send off, when they left school on that final Friday. We wish them all every success in their futures.

We have also been exceptionally proud of our key workers' children, who have come into school and worked hard on their studies – they have been a credit to their families.

In our first parents' forum, held back in November 2019, parents asked that we have one central place for all information and communication to come from. I am pleased to say that in September we are launching Talaxy, which is linked to Insight (so passwords won't change!); this will enable your child to logon to access homework and they can also upload it to their teachers. I am also pleased to advise parents that all other action points raised in the meeting have now been completed. Due to its success, we will host another parents' forum in 2020/2021.

We are really looking forward to meeting our new Year 7s in September, Mr Byrne our Head of Key Stage 3 and Transition, has done a fantastic job providing a virtual induction and transition pack for them – my welcome message can also be found on the school's website. We know that most schools will not be able to provide an Open Evening for our 2021 Year 7 intake, but do not worry because our team are working really hard on providing a virtual Open Evening, which will be launched on our website in autumn.

We are very excited that we are able to open our doors to all our students again in September, and we will do what we do best: Be an exceptional team!



Although this has been one of the most disjointed years due to Covid-19, almost every student in every year group at Millfield had a personal and meaningful interaction with a variety of employers and post 16 training providers. Of the many hands-on and practical experiences, amongst the most memorable was back in October when every Year 9 student joined with the army in a 3D practical problem solving event in the sports hall. This involved a range of tasks which relied on excellent communication skills, team work and resilience. Year 8 students were in for a rare treat in October when they all took part in a 'Mini Speed Networking' event with employers from some very different disciplines including the building and construction industry, manufacturing and a national government department. In November, a number of Year 10 students went to Manchester to the UCAS 'Create Your Future' exhibition where they had a unique face-to-face experience with literally hundreds of creative courses, traineeships and careers in design, music and performing arts, etc.

This well-attended annual event offered the opportunity for all students and parents/carers to engage with employers, training providers, Universities and supporting organisations. Amongst the other visits and experiences were trips to Myerscough College, to see all of their amazing facilities and courses, the BAE Systems apprenticeship show at Mill Farm where students had personalised presentations about engineering, accounting, project management and design; Morrisons, Lancashire Fire and Rescue, Victrex and Barclay's Bank through their Life Skills Transformation Trust were amongst a host of other organisations who kindly gave their time to help all our students to experience an exciting vision of just how bright their futures might be.
