Dear Parents and Carers,

The students and staff have made an exceptional start to the new academic year and I can hardly believe that we have nearly completed our first half term! Our team have quickly adapted to the new routines of school life, which has providing a high-quality full curriculum, in a covid-safe environment, firmly at its core.

Thank you to the parents who completed the Year 7 feedback survey last week. It gives the team and I immense pride to know that our newest members of Team Millfield have transitioned so well into high

school. We had 62 parental responses, and we received exceptional feedback: 100% of parents said their child feels settled, happy and safe at Millfield; 100% of parents said there was a good range of subjects at Millfield and 61 parents said they would recommend Millfield to other parents. Parents also commented that they were really happy with everything Millfield is doing to keep their children safe and provide them with a smooth transition into high school. Others said that their children liked every single one of their teachers and felt valued and cared for. Parents also said that the communication from the school had been exceptional and allowed them time to discuss things with their child before they took place.

I am also pleased to announce our interactive virtual open evening is now live on school website; it can be accessed via a link on the school website's opening page.

In terms of teaching and learning, our new remote learning policy is available on our school's website; the flow charts at the end of the policy explain what will happen if students are required to work from home. Also available are curriculum-linked lessons (in the pupils/remote learning section of the website); these should be accessed if your child is required to self-isolate for 14 days and is still well enough to complete work.

Many parents ask us what their child is or will be learning; if you look in the departments area on the school website, you can find our new learning journeys, which detail what your child is learning in all their subjects.

For our Year 11 parents and students, we are still no clearer about next year's GCSE examinations and are waiting for an update from the government. We are going to resume intervention sessions to support catch-up after half term. To safely facilitate this, after half term we are swapping the finishing times of Year 9 and 11: Year 9 will leave at 2:40pm and Year 11 will leave at 3pm.

I hope that you all enjoy the half term and manage to spend some quality time with your children.

### Teaching and Learning Netices

### How do I find out what my child will be learning?

If you would like to know what your child will be learning, you can access all department learning journeys on our school website. Visit www.millfield.lancs.sch.uk and select the department tab; here you will find all our curriculum areas and their learning journey.

### What do I do if my child has to self-isolate but is well enough to complete work?

If your child is required to self-isolate but is well enough to complete school work, there are now year group outlines on our school website that pupils can access.

Your child will need to go to the school website using www.millfield.lancs.sch.uk, select the pupil tab, then remote learning. Within this section there is a folder for each year group. If your child selects the appropriate year group, there are outlines for every subject. The outline is split into weeks and states the focus for the week, accompanied by links that will support their learning. There is additional information on the outlines including success criteria, how to receive feedback, and the appropriate email addresses for teachers should your child require further guidance or support. We hope this will support your child if they are required to learn remotely.

### Scientific Calculators

A reminder to all parents and carers that all pupils should have a scientific calculator as part of their equipment. Mrs Hall (Head of Key Stage 4 Maths) sent out a letter with recommendations and instructions of how to purchase a calculator from school if you would prefer.



Please make sure you log in to Talaxy (parents and students). All home learning tasks are now being set on there.



## **Teaching and Learning Tip**

Growth mindset tip no.2: Give frequent feedback

The "Growth mindset" is the belief that "your basic qualities are things you can cultivate through your efforts" – Carol Dweck.

**Theory**: People with a good growth mindset are better at assessing their own performance because they believe they can develop themselves. This means they're more open to accurate information about their abilities, even when it challenges them to do better and improve.

**Action**: Talk through completed home learning tasks and ask your child what they have done well and what they could do better. Give time to provide feedback and discuss ways to make further progress in future tasks. Praise effort NOT outcomes. Ask if they have shown their best effort.
