Year 10 students have had assemblies and received information about planning for work experience. This is a fantastic




opportunity for our students and they should be encouraged to organise their own placements in a field of work which interests them. Again, any questions should be addressed to Mrs Draper initially.






Home - Learning

Revision week

It is important that students evaluate their own revision by asking: has this particular strategy helped me? Can I remember more after using this revision strategy? Do I feel more confident with the work?

I would encourage students to reflect on these new revision strategies in order to work out what works best for them and how they can use them to prepare for any future assessments.
