Dear Parents and Carers

It has been a very busy few weeks for all our students as they have been studying hard, revising and completing their end of term assessments. Our Year 11s have been revising for their mock exams, which have started this week, and their determined and focussed attitude has been outstanding; on Monday morning all 170 students sat the first exam – impeccable behaviour throughout – we are so proud of them. The mock exams this year are especially important as they will be used as evidence if the GCSE examinations are cancelled next year; this is one of the contingency plans the government has put in place. We are of

course planning for the exams to go ahead, and it is important that all Year 11s are ready for this, which our dedicated team of teachers are fully preparing them for.

It is fantastic to see all the extracurricular opportunities starting again, as we begin to get some normality into our children's lives. Here are just a few examples from the last two weeks:

On 16th November, my daughter and I had the absolute pleasure of watching our exceptional dancers from Years 7 to 11 perform on stage at the Wyre and Fylde Dance Festival. The event showcased eighteen primary schools and four secondary schools. It was an incredibly proud moment when our dancers came on stage; they were superb and the audience around me were particularly impressed with the tap-dancing section. A teacher from a primary school said our girls were inspirational and always gave the primary children dancing to aspire to. A huge well done and thank you must go to Miss Kilmartin and Miss Longworth for all their teaching, choreography and rehearsals with the performers.

As part of our Careers Programme, a group of students in Year 10 visited Fleetwood Nautical College to learn about the Merchant Navy. Students were very impressed with the facilities and showed a keen interest in the full mission ship bridge simulator and the engine room simulator. On 23<sup>rd</sup> November we welcomed the BBC into school; they delivered workshops on careers in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) to all our Key Stage 3 students.

We have hosted inter-school primary competitions in our sports hall; our Key Stage 4 Sports Leaders have been incredible and received the following praise: "Your sports leaders were outstanding! The leaders were front of house for all to see and represented your school and the PE Department with great maturity and work ethic!"

We are now planning ahead and looking forward to having some normality back to our Christmas events: the Christmas Carol Service at Thornton Methodist Church and, of course, we will be bringing back our hugely popular (and hugely missed!) staff pantomime!

#### **Jumping Frogs puzzle**






#### Rules







The evening will be on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> December at 6.30pm, in the school theatre, and refreshments will be served. Parents should attend without their child.



## Pastoral and Wellbeing








