Dear Parents and Carers

Our Celebration of Music event, held at the Winter Gardens on 7<sup>th</sup> March, was a tremendous success. We watched the incredible primary and secondary school children from across the Fylde Coast perform on stage for the first time in three years. The Mayor, Andrea Kay, was in attendance and commented on the outstanding talent we have across our schools. Well done to our acapella group and dancers; their performance was exceptional.

One of the wonderful things about being a headteacher is working with Millfield's fabulous staff and students. Last week, we delivered a special PSHE lesson on the conflict in Ukraine, so the students could learn about the war and express their feelings. Mrs Wilson's form wrote letters to me, in them they conveyed how they were feeling about the war and how they were desperate to help the families dealing with the conflict in Ukraine. One of their suggestions was wearing blue and yellow and donating money; this coincided with the national Day for Ukraine and so our students once again, thinking of others, donated money to help those in crisis.

In art, Mrs Devaney's classes having been showing their support for the people of Ukraine by creating sunflowers; these sunflowers have messages and feeling about the conflict. Eleven of our students have had their artwork chosen to be displayed at Blackpool and The Fylde College as part of 'The Gazette Young Seasiders Arts and Crafts Exhibition 2022'. Thank you to Miss Gower who took three of our Year 11 students to Blackpool Sixth Form on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> March to celebrate International Women's Day. In school, our students had assemblies delivered on the theme of inspirational women.

# KEY STAGE

**Graduation and Exceptional** 

The last couple of weeks have been a difficult time for many of our KS3 students. I know many students have felt scared and anxious over what is happening to the people of Ukraine which is why our PSHE lesson was focused on this last week. In the PSHE lesson we discussed not only what is going on between Ukraine and Russia, but why this is happening including the history of Russia and Ukraine, and the Orange Revolution. Hopefully, through educating the students on the current situation, we have given some students comfort and reassurance of their safety in the United Kingdom. In other lessons, Year 7 students have been writing their own poems and preparing them to go on display. Students still have the second half of their Bollywood dances to complete and will be ready to perform in the next couple of weeks. In Design Technology, the students have been designing lamps and building electronics, whilst our food students have been learning to prepare their own healthy, tasty pasta salad.

#### **Revision week**

In preparation for our KS3 tests, students should now be highlighting topics and aspects of their learning that they will need to revisit during their revision week. We should remember that revision is the act of looking again at something previously written, studied or enacted to either commit it to memory, change it, or improve it. For this to be successful students should discuss their learning with teachers and review work from previous lessons. This will highlight areas for them to concentrate their time on for study. Successful techniques include:

- Creating mind maps with questions in the centre and then planning answers in the extensions.
- Cue cards with either a key word and definition written on both sides or common questions and the answers written on the reverse. These can then be used to test students.
- Reviewing websites like BBC Bitesize.
- Quizlet is another website that allows students to be quizzed on test style questions.
- Reviewing knowledge organisers or having a go at creating your own.

## **Programme**

The Graduation and **Exceptional Awards** programmes are now coming to the end. Students

have until the May half term to complete the tasks to see which grade they will graduate with. Special considerations will be made for attendance this year, but tasks will need to be completed. Final amendments are being made to the Graduation Ceremony and party day. Distinction star students will also be choosing their end of year trip after the Easter holidays. Students will not want to miss out when the ceremonies come ground!



### Definition – why is Home-Learning important?

Home-learning bridges the gap between school and home. Here at Millfield we believe in a collaborative approach, which allows students, teachers and parents to monitor the progress of their child in the learning process. Common home-learning assignments may include required reading, writing or typing projects, mathematical exercises to be completed, information to be reviewed before a test, or other skills to be practised.

As a parent, here are a few things you may wish to consider:


- ⇒ Home-learning improves student achievement.

  Studies show that home-learning improves student achievement in terms of improved grades, test results, and the likelihood to attend college
- Home-learning helps to reinforce learning and develop good study habits and life skills.

  Everyone knows that practise makes perfect. Students typically retain only 50% of the information teachers provide in class, and they need to apply that information in order to truly learn it.
- ⇒ Home-learning allows parents to be involved with their child's learning.

  Thanks to take-home assignments, parents are able to track what their children are learning at school as well as their academic strengths and weaknesses.

Here at Millfield we celebrate excellence and home-learning is no exception:-Congratulations go to students in Music with Mrs. Hill. who produced a great piece of work about how music is effectively used in T.V. Adverts.



## **Teaching and Learning Tips**

#### **KS3 Revision Week**

In order to be successful you must plan your revision carefully in advance. Here are some really effective revision strategies to get you started:


#### Mind Maps

### Why are mind maps useful?

- Mind maps these help you to reduce a whole topic into key pieces of information (keywords, dates, definitions, quotes etc.)
- Mind maps are also a great way to see any links between the key pieces of information.
- They can act as a powerful memory aid in an exam because they are visual.

### How to create a mind map:

- Note down points in a spray pattern, starting from the centre and working outwards.
- Keep your points brief use key words, authors, theories or processes.
- Use lines to show connections between things.
- Be prepared to re-work the map until you are happy with the organisation.
- Include colour, symbols and pictures to make it more memorable.



### **Revision Clocks**

### Why are revision clocks useful?

Revision clocks are a great way to organise your time. Planning your time is a great way to stay focused, organised and maximise your revision.

### How to create a revision clock:

- 1. Read through your notes and then put them away.
- 2. Allocate sections of the clock to different topics or subtopics.
- 3. Give yourself a set amount of time to write down everything you can remember.
- 4. Check your notes to see how accurate you were or what you missed.

#### **High Frequency Cards**

#### Why are high frequency cards useful?

Testing yourself everyday is a good way to remember key information and to see the progress you are making.


#### How to create a set of high frequency cards:

- 1. Start with a list of things you need to remember.
- 2. Write a **BOLD** heading on each card. Keep the information on the card very simple a word and definition at most.
- 3. If you are revising a big topic you should colour code your cards for different types of information e.g. key words/ quotes/ dates/ formulas/exam command words

(You could put them up around the house so that you are constantly reminded of your learning).
