Main Uniform	House jumper White shirt and House tie or revere collar blouse. Black formal trousers. Students may wear bootcut, formal trousers, but they should be loose fitting and have no accessories such as studs etc Polishable black shoes (no trainers or canvas shoes) Outdoor coat	House jumper White shirt and house tie or revere collar blouse. 	<p><i>Students in Year 10 and 11 should wear the lower school uniform except:</i></p> <p><i>-Senior student jumper instead of house jumper.</i></p> <p><i>-Senior student tie unless wearing revere blouse.</i></p>	
Summer Uniform	Students who wish to do so can wear a Millfield polo t-shirt instead of a shirt & tie/ blouse from after the Easter holidays. Students also have the option of wearing shorts. (Please refer to section below)

PE	<p><u>INDOOR</u> Black and red 'Millfield' PE top. Black and red 'Millfield' PE shorts. Black 'Millfield' socks. Trainers</p> <p>*Millfield branded PE Skorts can still be worn by students who currently own one however these are being phased out of the uniform policy, and must not be worn once they've been grown out of.</p> <p><u>OUTDOOR</u> Any 'indoor' clothing or: Black 'Millfield' sports leggings, black tracksuit bottoms Black 'Millfield' hoody Training shoes (not pumps)</p> <p><u>ADDITIONAL ITEMS</u> Football Boots Gum Shield Shin Pads</p>	<p>Same as Key Stage 3 but students can wear black loose fitting sport shorts if they have grown out of the 'Millfield' shorts. Dance	Whole school uniform (as above). Trainers.	PE kit (as above) or black leotard with black tights/ leggings. Bare feet. No jewellery. Hair tied back.
Equipment		
Students are expected to arrive at school every day with the following as a minimum:	Equipment is checked every morning during registration. Students who do not have the minimum equipment will be recorded on Synergy. There is no negative point attributed to this sanction.	
1 x school bag 1 x pencil case 2 x blue or black pens 1 x pencil 1 x 15cm or 30 cm ruler 1 x Casio scientific calculator 1x copy of their timetable	Students who do not have the minimum equipment for the second time in a week will be placed in a Headteacher's detention. The student's Progress Lead will contact home to ensure parents are aware.	
	Students who do not have the minimum equipment for the third time in a week will be placed in Internal Provision for the day.	
	Students who repeatedly fail to attend school without equipment could be suspended due to persistent breach of school rules.	

All articles should be clearly marked with the owner's name. PE/dance kit should be brought to school on the day it is needed and taken home afterwards.

Millfield Science and Performing Arts: Examples of Acceptable Plain Black Trousers and Shorts*



Trousers must be formal, cotton, not slim-fit (not tight/fitted), plain and black. They must be worn with plain black socks and usual school shoes.



* Shorts must be loose fitting, and on the knee, no brands must be visible and they may be worn in the summer term only, with short black, plain ankle socks and normal school shoes.

Please note:

- 1) Hair should be neat, tidy and conventionally styled and naturally coloured. It should be worn in a style which is safe for school.
- 2) Trainers or baseball caps are not acceptable with uniform. Baseball caps will be confiscated and returned at 2.50 p.m.
- 3) One simple plain ring, inexpensive wristwatch and studs (maximum of two per ear) are the only items of jewellery permitted.
- 4) Face, tongue or body piercings in the form of rings, bars or hoops are not acceptable on health and safety grounds and will be removed.
- 5) Rings and watches will be removed for P.E. and (at the teacher's discretion) for practical lessons.
- 6) Students who cannot temporarily conform to school uniform rules due to injury must carry a dated medical note from a Doctor.
- 7) Discrete make-up which it deemed to be reasonable and acceptable is permissible.
- 8) Students are not allowed to wear their hoods up when in school for identification purposes.
- 9) Mobile phones are to be switched off and out of sight whilst on school grounds.
- 10) Any features which the Headteacher feels are not in keeping with the general ethos or positive philosophy of the school and its codes are not acceptable.
- 11) Pupils who do not conform to the uniform rules may be sent home so they can change into the correct uniform or placed in Internal Provision.

Additional notes

- a) Skirts should be worn at full length with no 'rolling' of the waistband and be at a professional length, on the knee.
- b) If students are found wearing trainers, canvas, or a non-regulation sports make without a medical note they will be asked to change into school pumps provided by the school.
- c) Parents are kindly asked to consider new piercings at the start of the summer holidays.
- d) Artificial nails and eyelashes should NOT be worn for school. Nails should be a neutral/natural colour.
- e) Minimal make-up may be worn but must be modest and appear as natural.
- f) Parents are invited to donate outgrown/unwanted uniform to the school.
- h) Year 11 hoodies are not part of school uniform and should not be worn in school.

This Policy may be revised at anytime in the school year.
