We've had an outstanding start to the new academic year. Our students are looking incredibly smart in their uniforms, and I would like to thank you for supporting the school in maintaining these high standards. At Millfield, we proudly hold high expectations for every child: we expect them to try their best in every lesson, behave well, and look after one another. I am pleased to say our students have already risen to this challenge, and I am incredibly proud of them. Our new Year 7s have also made a fantastic start, impressing their teachers with excellent manners, behaviour, and attitude to learning. Well done to them all!



Our wide range of lunchtime and after-school clubs is now up and running. Please encourage your child to get involved and try something new. You can find full details in the extracurricular section of our website.

We are also celebrating another year of improved GCSE and vocational results. Schools are measured on 'Attainment 8' - a government metric that averages a student's grades across eight key GCSE subjects, with English and maths counting twice. I am proud to share that our Attainment 8 score this year is the highest in the school's history and significantly above the national average. We are delighted with what our Class of 2025 achieved and wish them every success in their bright futures.

Back in 2005, Millfield gained specialist status as a 'Science and Performing Arts College'. Although the associated funding ended in 2011, we retained the title. As one of the few schools still using this outdated designation, we've decided to update our name and from September 2026, we will be known as Millfield School. Rest assured, this change will not affect how we operate; we will continue to offer a broad, rich curriculum and an extensive extracurricular programme. Our new logo will still feature the Marsh Mill windmill, honouring our school's tradition and our community's heritage.

This change also aligns with planned government legislation on branded school uniforms. From September 2026, it is proposed that schools will be limited to four compulsory logo-branded items. We will phase in the new Millfield School logo on our uniform starting with the Year 7 2026 cohort, ensuring no additional cost to our families.

As a parent, here are a few things you may wish to consider:

Pro 1 – Home-learning improves student achievement.

Studies show that home-learning improves student achievement in terms of improved grades, test results, and the likelihood to attend college

Pro 2- Home-learning helps to reinforce learning and develop good study habits and life skills.

Everyone knows that practise makes perfect. Students typically retain only 50% of the information teachers provide in class, and they need to apply that information in order to truly learn it.

Pro 3- Home-learning allows parents to be involved with their child's learning.

Thanks to take-home assignments, parents are able to track what their children are learning at school, as well as, their academic strengths and weaknesses.

Every year on **12th September** people around the world come together to celebrate **World Dolphin Day**. This day is dedicated to raising awareness about dolphins, their importance in the natural world, and the challenges they face because of human activity. Dolphins are among the most intelligent and fascinating animals on our planet, and World Dolphin Day gives us the chance to reflect on why they matter and how we can protect them.

Dolphins are mammals, just like humans. They breathe air, give birth to live young, and feed their calves with milk. They are highly social animals that live in groups called **Pods**, and they communicate with each other using a variety of whistles, clicks, and body movements. Scientists have discovered that dolphins use something like "names," a unique whistle that identifies each individual. Their intelligence, playfulness, and ability to work together make them one of the most admired creatures in the animal kingdom.

World Dolphin Day also reminds us that dolphins play an important role in marine ecosystems. They help maintain the balance of the food chain by preying on fish and squid. Healthy dolphin populations are a sign of a healthy ocean, which is vital for all life on Earth, including humans.

However, despite their popularity and importance, dolphins face many serious threats. One of the biggest dangers is **pollution**. Plastics, chemicals, and oil spills can poison the waters where dolphins live. Many dolphins have been found with plastic waste in their stomachs, which can cause injury or death. Climate change also affects them by warming oceans and disrupting the distribution of fish, making it harder for dolphins to find food.

Another major problem is **fishing practices**. Dolphins can become trapped in fishing nets, a problem known as "bycatch," which kills thousands of dolphins every year. In some parts of the world, dolphins are still hunted for their meat, even though this practice is widely condemned. Noise pollution from ships and underwater drilling is also harmful, as it interferes with dolphins' use of echolocation — the natural sonar system they rely on to navigate and hunt.



World Dolphin Day encourages governments, organisations, and individuals to take action. Laws and agreements, such as marine protected areas and bans on harmful fishing methods, have been introduced in many countries to safeguard dolphin populations. Campaigns also call for reducing plastic waste, lowering carbon emissions, and promoting responsible tourism, where people can enjoy watching dolphins without disturbing their natural behaviour.



For young people, World Dolphin Day is an opportunity to learn how our choices affect the oceans. Simple actions such as recycling, reducing single-use plastics, and supporting conservation charities can make a real difference. Schools and communities often use this day to organise events, lessons, and projects that spread awareness about dolphins and ocean conservation.

In conclusion, World Dolphin Day is more than just a celebration of a much-loved animal. It is a reminder of our responsibility to protect the oceans and the creatures that depend on them. By understanding the threats dolphins face and working together to reduce them, we can help ensure that these incredible animals continue to thrive for generations to come.

Two weeks before the end of each term a list of all lost property is given to each form, and displayed on the reception window - any item not claimed by the end of term is taken to charity.






All-aboard for the third amazing journey in the bestselling Adventures on Trains series, Murder on the Safari Star, illustrated throughout by Elisa Paganelli.

Five top tips to keep children safe from button batteries

Button batteries can badly hurt or kill a small child if they swallow one. They look like a coin.

Follow our tips to keep your child safe:

- 1** **LOOK** around your home for button batteries. Think toys, lights, remote controls and more.
- 2** **CHECK** for products with loose backs and button batteries that have dropped out.
- 3** **STORE** button batteries in a safe place, up high and out of your child's reach.
- 4** **DISPOSE** of used button batteries as soon as you can. They are still unsafe.
- 5** **ACT** if you think your child may have swallowed a button battery, go straight to A&E or call an ambulance.
