Students are expected to arrive at school every day with the following as a minimum: 1 x school bag 1 x pencil case 2 x blue or black pens 1x purple pen (initially supplied by school) 1 x pencil 1 x 15cm or 30 cm ruler 1 x Casio scientific calculator 1x copy of their timetable (initially supplied by school) 1x reading book 1x independent literacy book (initially supplied by school)		Equipment is checked every morning during registration. Students who do not have the minimum equipment will be recorded on Synergy. There is no negative point attributed to this sanction. Students who do not have the minimum equipment for the second time in a week will be placed in a Headteacher's detention. The student's Progress Lead will contact home to ensure parents are aware. Students who do not have the minimum equipment for the third time in a week will be placed in Internal Provision for the day. Students who repeatedly fail to attend school without equipment could be removed from the school community due to persistent breach of school rules.

FAQs:

- Hair:** should be neat, tidy, conventionally styled and naturally coloured and not shorter than a grade 2.
- Trainers:** students wearing trainers without a medical note will be required to wear pumps which will be provided.

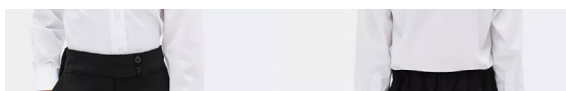
3. **Jewellery/Accessories:** One plain simple ring, an inexpensive wristwatch and plain studs (maximum of two per ear) are the only items permitted. Students should not wear bracelets, necklaces, other piercings, smart watches or any other item not listed as permitted. "Invisible" retainers are also not permitted.
4. **Jewellery/Accessories:** all jewellery should be removed for PE and other practical lessons at the teacher's discretion.
5. **Make-up:** discreet make-up which is deemed reasonable and acceptable is permissible. Students deemed to be wearing excessive make up will be provided with wipes so it can be removed.
6. **Coats-** students should not wear expensive coats to school. They are not to worn around the building for identification purposes. A coat is defined as having a full-length zip; students should not bring additional branded jumpers or hoodie to wear as a coat.
7. **Nails/Lashes:** false lashes and/or nails should not be worn. This includes all brands, makes and materials including extensions and builder gel. The general premise is that students shouldn't have anything other than their own natural lashes and nails. *Only clear* nail polish can be worn- students will be told remove any colour.
8. **Fake Tan/Henna:** Fake tan may be worn; however, it must be discreet, subtle, and natural-looking. Excessively dark, streaky, or highly noticeable fake tan is not permitted. Henna (mehndi) must not be worn in school, except where it is required for genuine religious observance. In such cases, parents/carers may be asked to provide confirmation that the use of henna is connected to a sincerely held religious belief.
9. **Mobile devices:** students will turn phones off in form and they will remain off until 2.50pm. Students should only turn their phones on when they have left the building at 2.50pm.
10. **Skirts:** the school has a zero-tolerance policy to skirts; they should be worn at full length and rest 'on the knee'. If a student is found to be "rolling" their skirt or pulling their skirt above their waist on three occasions, they will be required to wear trousers.

Additional Info:

1. The Headteacher reserves the right to make amendments to this policy if she feels a student is not keeping with the general ethos or positive philosophy of the school.
2. The school is committed to the *Halo Code*. We welcome Afro-textured hair worn in all styles however require any head wraps and scarves to be plain black in line with the school uniform. Hair should be tied up to ensure students are safe and be of a natural colour.
3. h) Reasonable adjustments will be made to the policy on an individual basis to accommodate clothing pertaining to a religious belief. The school recognises that some religions and beliefs require their adherents to conform to a particular dress code or to otherwise outwardly manifest their belief. For example, a necklace and cross may be worn out of sight but for health and safety reasons must be removed for PE.
4. Parents are invited to donate outgrown/unwanted uniform to the school.
5. Parents are kindly asked to consider new piercings at the start of the summer holidays.
6. In the event of extreme heat, students will be informed they can wear their PE shorts and PE t-shirt. These are the only items of clothing that students will be permitted to wear.
7. Students who do not conform to the uniform rules will be sent home so they can change into the correct uniform. Their absence will be recorded as unauthorised until they return to school following the school's policy.



Millfield Science and Performing Arts: Examples of Acceptable Plain Black Trousers and Shorts*





Trousers must be formal, cotton, not slim-fit (not tight/fitted), plain and black. They must be worn with plain black socks and usual school shoes.



Shorts must be loose fitting, and on the knee, no brands must be visible and they may be worn in the summer term only, with short black, plain ankle socks and normal school shoes.



This Policy may be revised at anytime in the school year.

Millfield School Uniform Expectations: Skirt Length Policy

At Millfield School, skirts are an *optional* item of school uniform.

Where a skirt is chosen to be worn, it must be worn on the knee at all times, with opaque (100 denier) black tights. This expectation applies regardless of a student's height or year group.

We expect parents and carers to follow the advice of our uniform suppliers when purchasing skirts, as suppliers stock approved items specifically designed to meet our school policy.

Compliant skirt lengths are available for all students, including those who are short (under 5ft), or very tall (over 6ft). These lengths are:

- 20 inch (will only be sold to students who are under 5ft tall and you will be required to buy a new one as your child grows)
- 22 inch
- 24 inch
- 26 inch

Please note:

- If a skirt is purchased that does not meet the school's on-the-knee requirement, parents/carers will be asked to purchase a replacement skirt of the correct length.
- If a student arrives at school wearing an incorrectly sized or altered skirt, they will be instructed to wear black school trousers, as per uniform policy (at cost to the parent/carer), until the matter is resolved.
- As your child grows, it is the responsibility of parents/carers to replace skirts as necessary to ensure the on-the-knee policy continues to be followed.
- Choosing to wear the optional skirt means accepting and complying with these expectations in full.
